iFestival 2011

iFestival 2011 will take place in the Central Library, Ilac Centre from the 10th to the 30th of June 2011. The interactive exhibition will display a range of comics, 3d designs, digital pictures, photo journals, games, videos, animation and much more! The exhibition will provide us with an opportunity to celebrate the achievements of all age groups from the Community Centres, facilitators, schools, teachers and youth involved in ICT Projects over the year.

This booklet outlines in detail the project guidelines and competition details for school going children. It can also act as a guide for adults who have completed Community Centre computer courses and are now participating in ICT Projects. Further details of adult courses can be found in a separate booklet or www.clicdublin.ie.

- You do not need to print anything for iFestival.
- All work (except school websites) must be submitted on CD, DVD, memory key or by email and be accompanied by a table with names of participating children, the class and the project.
- Files must be separated into projects and also class folders with the teacher's/facilitator's name. Email entries should be sent separately in a similar manner. Files must have the names of the children that created the work (except in the case of class/group projects).
- Facilitators/Teachers must nominate the top three entries in the individual categories.
- Multiple entries per child are permitted but only one participation certificate will be issued per child. Children can receive more than one award.
- The closing date for all projects is Friday 6th May.
Late entries cannot be accepted.
- Individual prizes are awarded to the best entries on a per class /age group basis from all the schools/centres participating.

Digital Painter

Group: Junior Infants up to 2nd Class Primary

Criteria: Using Microsoft Paint, or any painting program that you can export pictures as bmp, jpg or gif, produce an illustration under any of the following themes:

- **A Garden**
- **Animals**
- **The Circus**

The illustration must also contain a simple caption, the child's first name and school/centre name.

Prizes will be awarded for original work and stamps should be avoided if possible.

Animation

Group: All Primary and Secondary

Criteria: Any type of animation can be produced e.g. Pivot Stickfigure Animator, Crazy Talk, Scratch, Anime Studio, Moviesoup or Stop Motion.



Entries can be anchored in any subject area and therefore it should be possible to tie an animation in with work e.g. demonstrate gravity, illustrate a poem/story or animate a statement from an historical character .

Criteria: This year entries will need to have an historical theme. All Comics should be 1 page only. Pupils need to produce a newspaper/magazine front page which includes a photo and a short interview with an elderly relative, family friend or neighbour. The rest of the page should contain an original title for the newspaper/magazine as well as images and news from the period that the person being interviewed grew up.

Group: 3rd Class Primary Up and All Secondary

Criteria: What is a haiku? The haiku originated in Japan and is a verse (poem) written in three lines. The entire haiku is composed in 17 syllables. The first line contains five syllables, the second line has seven syllables, and the third and final line has five syllables. The poem should be typed up in a presentation program such as PowerPoint and illustrated with clipart or original art work.

Digital Photo

Group: 3rd Class Primary Up and All Secondary

Criteria: The theme for this project is "My City". Photos should capture what living in Dublin means to the pupil. The photo should be inserted into a presentation program such as PowerPoint on one slide taking up the majority of the space. An acrostic poem with the title DUBLIN should be included on the slide together with the pupil's first name, class and school. The poem should compliment the photo.



This is primarily a photo competition and therefore the photo must be taken by the pupil entering the competition. The grading of entries will be weighted 70% towards the quality of photo and 30% towards the acrostic poem.

Group: 3rd Class Primary Up and All Secondary

Criteria: Using a word processing programme or a desk top publishing programme e.g. Comic Life pupils need to produce an A4 advertising feature page for their favourite hobby or club.


The page should include original photos and text. The grading of entries will be weighted 50% towards the text, 30% for original photos and 20% for the layout of the page.

Criteria: The presentations can be on any subject fact or fiction. In junior classes the presentation **must** incorporate a major contribution from the children. The pupils might do a little typing or provide a voice over. The older pupils should be able to produce the Photo Stories themselves and they can work in pairs.

Video Making

Group: All Primary and Secondary

Criteria: Produce a video with your pupils using *Movie Maker*, *iMovie* or any other video editing program. In junior classes the video **must** incorporate a major contribution from the children which could include presentation, voice-overs and set creation. The older pupils should be also be able to participate in the research, recording and in some cases editing of the material. Prizes will be awarded for imagination and curriculum integration. The content can be on any subject fact or fiction. Duration should be 5 minutes maximum.

Criteria: Design and produce a computer game or app. The game/app must have a title screen to start with instructions on how to play the game or use the app. Only one level is necessary in a game. A screen must appear at the end to tell the player the game is over. A full credit must be seen on exiting the app. Pupils can use any game making program but it is suggested they use Game Maker, Scratch or The Games Factory. Android App Creator is recommended to make the app.
